




SHARING THE GOSPEL OF LIFE

SUFFERING FOR THE SAKE OF OTHERS








THRIVE, ST. LOUIS, MO PARTNER SINCE 2020

Jasmine's whole world changed when she suddenly, unexpectedly, became a mom. On a Wednesday morning at 5:53am, her daughter Jakobi was born and Jasmine did not have anything to take care of her child. A family member referred her to ThriVe where she enrolled in the Parent University program where she was equipped with not only educational and practical resources, but a community. "ThriVe is my support team. I have gained so many friends from 'Parent University.' And we celebrate each other. What I love about it is...It's like a sisterhood. It's all of us together as a family. And what I really, really, really love, is that ThriVe has stuck with me...when I learned how to put a car seat in the car...when I had to learn how to do resumes."

ThriVe also showed Jasmine the importance of spirituality: "They taught me how to deepen my relationship with God to guide me as a mother. Parenting does not come with a manual or instructions, but God can guide you and lead in the right direction with parenting. They taught me things about motherhood that I never knew or thought about, that allowed me to appreciate motherhood more than I ever thought I could. Sometimes being a mother can be challenging. You work, take care of your family, and make sure everything is correct before taking care of yourself. But You never know who God will put in your life to help you. ThriVe was placed in my life, and I have been blessed beyond words."






