The stage is set to lead young adults to a life-changing response to the way God has made them, and help them experience the culture of life, one that highlights that each person has profound dignity.

AND EVEN HAVE A SOLUTION...

We believe that transforming the hearts and minds of young adults through missionary discipleship, with a deep focus on the Gospel of life, is crucial for renewing the culture of life which will shape future generations.

WHICH CREATES GENERATIONAL IMPACT.

Having encountered Jesus through a lived experience of sacrificing time and energy on behalf of the culture of life, these young people walk away spiritually transformed. Their sacrifices deepen their love for God and neighbor, which they carry into their marriages, their careers, their volunteerism, and their philanthropy.

In addition to the missionaries and pregnancy centers, we've had an eventful year organizationally. Nikki Biese, our Executive Director of almost seven years, gave birth to her sixth child, prompting her to shift into a part-time Human Resources Manager role. Her skills and knowledge are certainly appreciated; we're glad she's still with us.

Formerly the Mission Advancement Director, I've now stepped into the role of President, effectively taking over Nikki's prior role with some differences. I'm looking forward to leading the organization into its next phase of life.

Sarah Wiese (former Operations and Marketing Director) changed roles and became the Recruiting and Marketing Director. To take over the operations of our National Ride and some other major events, we brought on Bridgette Behler as the Program Operations Director. To help with fundraising, we hired Joe Armen as the Advancement Coordinator. Finally, we brought long-time volunteer Josh Geinert on staff as the Missionary Formation Coordinator, helping the formation program succeed and improve.

All these developments are necessary to reach our lofty goals: by 2028, we intend to expand from coast to coast, forming missionaries, partnering with pregnancy centers, and sharing the culture of life on the National Ride in all four time zones.

From a personal life standpoint, in 2025, four Biking for Babies staff members welcomed new children and one staff member got engaged. Praise God!




MISSIONARY FORMATION

Young adults learn about the Gospel of Life through virtual small groups and educational and spiritual curriculum, leading them to a lived, personal encounter with Christ and understanding of the holiness of every child of God.

Pursuing the discipline of a disciple, both rider and support crew missionaries embark on spiritual and physical training programs, preparing them for the National Ride, a 6-day, 600-mile bicycle ride: a lived experience of sacrificing time and energy on behalf of the culture of life.

As missionary disciples of Christ, missionaries are then sent forth into their workplaces, schools, families, parishes, and communities to boldly share the spiritual truth that “losing their lives” (Mt 16:24-25) leads to fulfillment and joy, and that we are our brother’s keepers.

94% of missionaries report growth in the virtue of sacrificial love through their formation with Biking for Babies.

Missionaries often come into our program saying they want to grow in expressing their beliefs and not being afraid to share the truth and talk about being pro-life.

Excitingly, 97% of our missionaries self-report growth in confidence for sharing their pro-life beliefs.



GROWTH IN VIRTUE



RACHEL'S STORY

Rachel is a rider missionary from Connecticut who rode with the inaugural 2025 Maine Team. She shared this testimony after her first National Ride.

Biking for Babies has been a vessel through which God has taught me so much about what it means to truly live. God is continually pouring His love out to us in each moment. When we free our hearts to be present to the moment He has us in and receiving His love through the gift of the person placed in front of us, we can come to know God more intimately and experience true joy. Those moments of experiencing God through one another are some of the most powerful and tangible experiences of God's love for us as humans.

In the final moments upon the cross, there are two final remarks Jesus made and continues to speak to us today. One is the promise of eternity with Him to the repentant sinner who seeks refuge in Him (Luke 23:40-43). The other addresses how we should live our lives in relation to one another:

"When Jesus saw His mother and the disciple whom He loved standing beside her, He said to His mother, "Woman, behold your son." Then He said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his home." - John 19:26-27

This moment is so significant for us to ponder. Jesus thought that addressing His mother Mary and the disciple and telling them to care for one another as kin was important enough to be one of His final words. This speaks volumes about how we should love one another and how much God desires to give His love to us through the vessel of one another.

During my experience on the National Ride, I experienced this encounter of self-sacrificing and unconditional love so tangibly in each moment through my teammates, our generous hosts, and each person we encountered along the way at churches or even the most unlikely of stops.



RACHEL'S STORY, CONTINUED

This intentional encounter with God's love is what stirs true joy, a desire to choose to embrace the abundant life that God has waiting for us, and frees us to allow the Lord to use us a vessel through which He allows others around us to experience His love.

I have come to recognize that this is truly **the foundation and purpose of the pro-life effort and the Biking for Babies mission at large**. If a mother and father know the love of God for themselves through the care they receive from those God has placed in their life, they will have an encounter with true love and can more freely choose life for both them and their child.

Yes, being pro-life and the Biking for Babies mission is about helping mothers and fathers to recognize the beauty of the life of their unborn child and to assist them in getting the resources to choose to carry their pregnancy to term, but, more deeply than that, it is about loving those parents in a way that they understand their own dignity, worth, and experience God's intense love for them.

And this extends far beyond solely mothers and fathers who find themselves in challenging pregnancies. **It is for every person.**

God desires first and foremost for our own souls to have an encounter with His love in the present moment we are in, and yes that means right now as you are even reading this God is desperately pouring out His love to you and desiring you to be open to receiving it.

Once we receive and know His love for ourselves, we can be free to be God's vessel through which He allows those around us to experience His love. This is what I believe was in part what Christ was pointing to when He said those final words to His mother and the disciple. They were first receiving His love for them through His sacrifice on the cross and then He turns them to one another and commands them to be the vessel through which they will continue to experience His love.

PARTNERSHIP IMPACT

Because you give generously, we too are able to give generously to these pregnancy centers and their life-saving work. This year, we contributed **\$450,000 to 89 centers**. Our overall donation total is now an incredible and impactful

This partnership directly affects the women served by our pregnancy resource center partners, including Faith-Ann (pictured right) who was first served as a client of PRC Rolla and now serves as a coach for other women there. She shared,

“Since opening in 2007, PRC Rolla has saved 4,125 babies – my baby being one of them. So on behalf of PRC of Rolla and mothers facing unplanned pregnancies, thank you, Biking for Babies missionaries. You have been part of saving 4,125 babies’ lives – and, quite frankly, saving their parents’ lives as well. I say that because abortion would have changed me forever. It’s something I would never have come back from, and would have deeply regretted. But thankfully, my story turned out very differently. Please allow my face, and my son’s face, to stand for just one of the thousands you have impacted.” *-Faith-Ann*

Additionally, the centers have shared that both our financial support and partnership with young adults is tremendously impactful.

PARTNERSHIP IMPACT

The pregnancy center-missionary partnership continues to be a catalyst to conversion for the missionaries as they heard stories of lives changed and lives lost, and learned about the services provided to their own communities.

Each missionary visited a pregnancy resource center in 2025, and 94% self-reported growing in empathy for pregnant women and families. The vast majority of missionaries named visiting a pregnancy resource center as both informative and profoundly impactful. Amanda (pictured right) was able to share her center visit with her teammates during their National Ride; Richard (pictured right with Amanda), a staff member at Mother of Life Center, coordinated the team's stay.

TREY'S STORY

A longtime cyclist, Trey feels most like himself on two wheels. So when he heard about Biking for Babies, he knew that, combined with his openness to helping others and his pro-life beliefs, this was the mission for him.

Trey trained his best, wanting to honor God calling him to this mission at this time. He also called to mind his teammates, the mothers and families in unexpected pregnancies, and those working at pregnancy resource centers and offered up his sacrifice for them.

What was supposed to be a 16 hour journey from his home in Hawaii to his National Ride starting location in Maine turned into 33 hours after multiple flight delays. But Trey turned this annoyance into an opportunity for evangelization, wearing his Biking for Babies shirt and capitalizing on opportunities to share about the mission and what pregnancy resource centers are and what they can do for mothers and families.

Trey rode into this mission full of life and joy. He recognizes that joy is a gift from God, but what he didn't expect is how much he was able to grow in that gift during his time with Biking for Babies. He says, "it makes me so happy that God gave me this gift and I am able to share both that joy and the mission with others!"

RIDES FOR LIFE

Although our annual mission opportunity is designed for young adults, Rides for Life (RFL) unite entire communities across generations. Locally coordinated by volunteer mission partners, these one-day biking events raise both funds and awareness for formation initiatives, pregnancy resource centers, and maternity homes. Riders of all ages participate together, reflecting a shared commitment to life.

CENTRAL IOWA RFL

97 riders joined in the fifth annual Central Iowa Ride for Life, raising \$30,274 for four pregnancy resource centers and maternity homes near Ankeny, IA. It's a joy to continue to support the ongoing efforts for life across Iowa, and it was the best turnout and weather we've had of the past five rides. SHIPPENSBURG RFL




PHILLY RFL




NUMBER OF YOUNG ADULTS & PREGNANCY CENTERS

We desire a 1:1 ratio between our young adults and our partnering pregnancy centers because the centers aid in forming our missionaries through personal relationship and education.




FINANCIAL IMPACT BY YEAR

THE FIRST ALUMNI RIDE

We envision generations transformed by the Gospel of life, starting with young adults growing in their faith today and tomorrow radiating the love of Christ to their communities at large.

Since 2009, nearly 300 young adults have been sent out, ready to share about their conversions and experiences with Biking for Babies. So we invited them all back to experience the sacrificial nature of the National Ride again, and seven picked up the cross to participate in the inaugural Biking for Babies Alumni Ride, Retreat, and Reunion: **the BARRR.**

From Dyersburg, TN, to Manchester, MO, over two days, these alumni experienced 250 miles of riding—flat the first day, hilly the second, and a thousand degrees for both.

Some highlights included retreat talks by alumni themselves, different forms of prayer led by Fr. Patrick Hirtz (also an alumni), the generosity of officers in Dyers County, Caruthersville, Columbia, and South County who escorted the team down several highway segments for safety, and welcoming the 2025 National Ride missionaries at the finish line.

OUR 2028 MOONSHOT

This mission started because St. John Paul II's conviction about the dignity of human life and his message to young adults in particular moved two college students to put their love for endurance sports at the service of the culture of life. In 2009, on their spring break, they biked 600 miles across Illinois, praying and raising money for a pregnancy center. While on their ride, they visited the pregnancy center and held a newborn baby who was given life because of the pregnancy center's work. That experience changed their lives and motivated them to help more young adults have transformational encounters like the one they had.


This has grown into a national effort to transform the lives of young adults through missionary discipleship and the Gospel of life. In 16 years, Biking for Babies has now engaged almost 300 young adults, partnered with 175 pregnancy centers, and raised nearly \$2.5 million to help vulnerable families. **But we're not done.**


